TOUR OF SACRED SITES IN BOSNIA & HERZEGOVINA

17th - 23rd APRIL 2010

APRIL 17th - DAY 1

2.30pm collection at Dubrovnik Airport by mini van (BA, London to Dubrovnik lands at this time). Drive North, into Bosnia Herzegovina, through TREBINJE, to STOLAC, where we stop at RADMILJA to view the unique medieval tomb stones, with their extraordinarily carved symbols, associated with the 'heretical' Bosnian Church/Bogomil/Islamic past. Then to MOSTAR, where we will see the exquisite Stari Most Bridge built to symbolise unity; now beautifully reconstructed since its destruction in 1993. Evening meal together and free time to wander in this small city. Overnight at MOSTAR.

APRIL 18th - DAY 2

One hour drive to BLAGAJ, to the source of the Buna River, as it surges out through the dazzling white cave mouth. The caves here have been home to man since Neolithic times and the Blagaj has been a place of pilgrimage through many eras - the goddess, kings, Sufis and Dervish.

One hour drive to MEDUGORJE, place of Roman Catholic pilgrimage since 1981, when 6 teenagers saw 'Our Lady' there. Approx. 3 hours travel. Overnight at SARAJEVO

APRIL 19th - DAY 3

SARAJEVO Tour: Austro-Hungarian Architecture; 16th century Mosques; Eastern Orthodox and Catholic Churches; Synagogue; 'Tunnel of Life', built beneath the airport runway during the nearly 4 year siege 1992-95 (the only access for food, water, medicine and fuel - only a small section at the entrance is preserved). All sites which demonstrate the rich mosaic that was Sarajevo's past, in the heart of Europe. Free time to wander and to shop. Overnight SARAJEVO.

APRIL 20th - DAY 4

Short drive Sarajevo to VISOKO, where we visit the 'Bosnian Pyramids' - the amazing and mysterious discovery by Semir Osmanagic in 2004. Pyramid of the Sun, Moon, Dragon, Earth and Love. We hope to

be able to enter sections of the interconnecting underground tunnels. Vegetation in the tunnels is said to have been dated to approx. 30,000 years B.C.E. Free time in Sarajevo. Optional evening meal at restaurant overlooking the city. Overnight SARAJEVO.

APRIL 21st - DAY 5

Drive approx. 5 hours to SREBRENICA, stop for coffee en route at OLOVO. We hope to visit 'Our Lady of Olovo', revered by Christian and Moslem alike. On to POCOCARI, where we visit the very moving Memorial Centre, established to honour the approx. 8,000 men and boy victims of the 1995 genocide. Ten minute drive into SREBRENICA, which was a beautiful, ancient Spa town, known for the healing properties of its waters; the silver mined since Roman times in its mountains, and the dense forests which surround it. Overnight SREBRENICA.

APRIL 22nd - DAY 6

Drive to VISEGRAD, lunch by the Ottoman bridge, made famous by Ivo Andric. Long drive South to overnight stop in TREBINJE

APRIL 23rd - DAY 7

Early am departure to DUBROVNIK - free morning to explore the old city. Afternoon departure to Dubrovnik airport, for those wishing to fly.

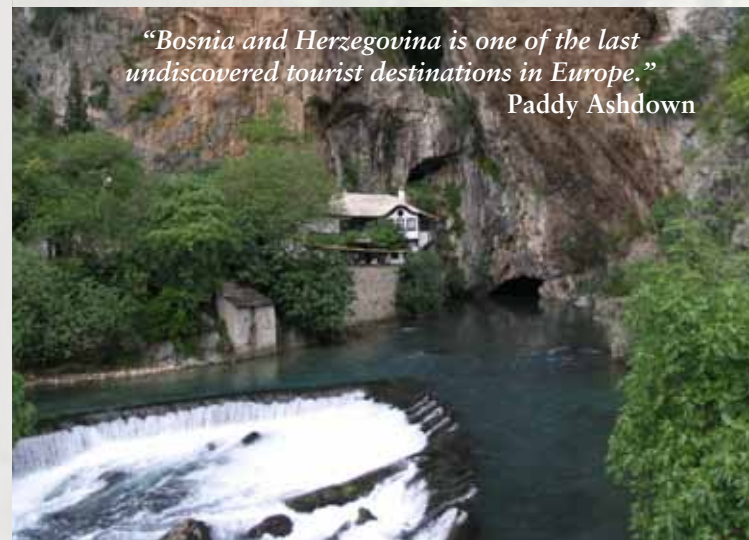
